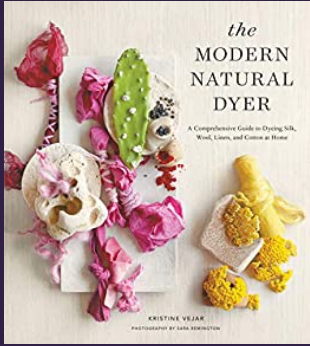
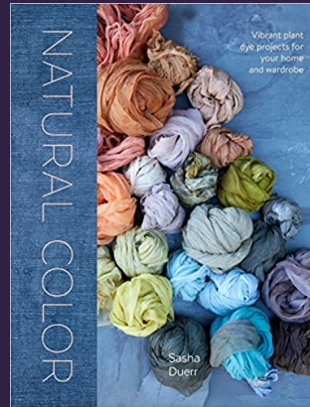

Kit Contents:

- 1 Cotton Drawstring Bag
- 3 Tbsp. Turmeric Powder
- 1 Cup White Vinegar

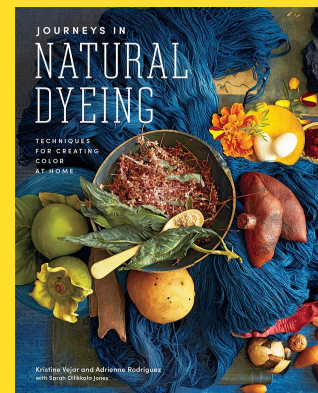
Instructions:

1. In a large pot, add 1 gallon of water, 1 cup of vinegar, and 3 tbsp. and bring it to a low boil.
2. Using warm water, wet your cotton bag completely.
3. Once dyeing pot is boiling, add in your cotton bag and boil until your bag is the desired color. The longer it boils, the deeper yellow it will become.
4. Once the bag has reached the desired color, take it out of the pot (carefully!) and run it under cold water. Once cool, open it up and enjoy the beauty of this naturally occurring color!

Using items you may already have in your pantry, you can create a world full of naturally occurring color!
